Tour Overview

This 15-day Yukon and Alaska journey takes you deep into the Canadian Northwest and Southeast Alaska, traveling from the shores of the Pacific Ocean to the edge of the Arctic Ocean on one extraordinary expedition.

Cross mountain ranges, boreal forest, tundra, and Arctic landscapes as you follow legendary northern routes including the Alaska Highway, Haines Road, Klondike Highway, Campbell Highway, Dempster Highway, and Canada's newest road, the Inuvik–Tuktoyaktuk Highway (ITH). Each mile reveals a new chapter of the North.

Along the way, immerse yourself in the rich stories of the region; from First Nations and Inuit cultures to the building of the Alaska Highway and the legacy of the Klondike Gold Rush, all set against vast wilderness and remarkable wildlife.

Itinerary

Day 1 - Arrival Day

Welcome to Whitehorse! Your tour guide will personally pick you up from the airport and give you an orientation tour of Whitehorse on the way to your hotel. This evening you will join the rest of the group over an included Welcome Dinner. This is a great opportunity to meet your travel companions for the coming days, and to ask your guide any questions you might still have.

Day 2 - Highlights Of Whitehorse

After a long day of travel yesterday, we start the tour with a relaxing day, combining a city tour of Whitehorse, and the surrounding areas, a guided trip around the Yukon Wildlife Preserve, followed by a soak in the luxurious Eclipse Nordic Hot Springs!

Day 3 - Haines, Alaska via Kluane National Park

Today we set off along the Alaska Highway to the edge of Kluane National Park, home to 17 of Canada's 20 highest peaks. As the drive there winds through the Yukon wilderness, we pass through the territory of various wild horse, elk and bison herds. Not to mention all the black and grizzly bears that roam the area.

Once we arrive in Haines Junction, we will pay a visit to the Kluane National Park and Reserve Visitor Centre. After we've learned about the park and the largest non-polar ice field within it.

After lunch in Haines Junction, we head south. As we head towards the Alaskan coast, we'll make a stop at Kathleen Lake, before heading over the Haines Pass, passing through a spectacular region, frequently populated with sightings of bears, bison, and elk.

Day 4 - Free Day In Haines

Today is a choose your own adventure day. With countless activities to choose from in the Haines area, you won't be left twiddling your thumbs! We highly recommend a day trip down the Inside Passage, to the Alaskan capital of Juneau, on a whale watching boat! With whales, porpoise, sea lions and countless waterfalls along the way, you'll see why the Inside Passage is so famous.

Other local activities include sea kayaking, hiking, bear watching, rafting, fishing... the list really is endless.

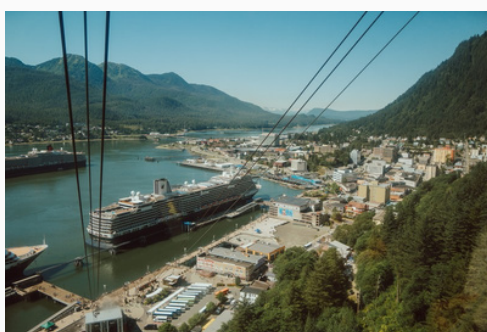
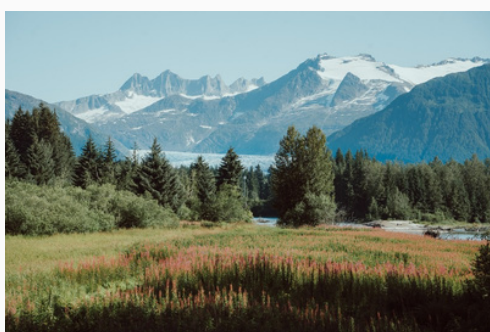
Overnight in Haines, Alaska

Day 5 - Skagway, Alaska

Today we jump on the ferry for a short ride to the Alaskan town of Skagway. During the Klondike Gold Rush, this is where most stampeders started their overland journey to the Klondike.

Today, a lot of the buildings on Broadway still look like they used to 125 years ago. After arriving in Skagway, you'll go for a drive around the coast to Dyea, to see the trail head of the Chilkoot Trail. Then after checking into your hotel, and an orientation tour of Skagway, it's a free afternoon for you to explore.

Day 6 - Crossing the Coast Mountains via the White Pass

Today we leave to Pacific coast, and cross the Coast Mountains, through the White Pass, back into Canada. Whether you choose to drive the White Pass with your guide, or take the optional historic White Pass Railway excursion, one of the greatest train rides in the world, you be blown away by the scenery!

After regrouping in Canada, we head east on the Alaska Highway to Watson Lake for a couple of nights.

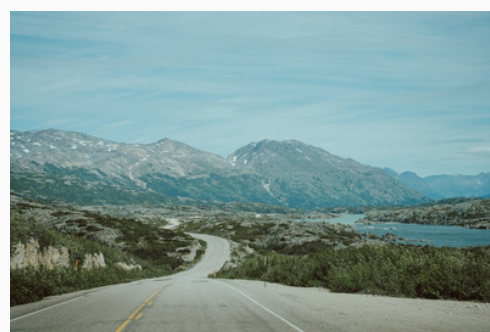

Day 7 - The Northern Rockies

Today we'll make a visit to the Liard Hot Springs, quite possibly the most beautiful natural hot springs in all of Canada. But not before we head into the stunning Northern Rockies for lunch!

After a drive to the beautiful Muncho Lake, and lunch at the Muncho Lake Lodge, we head back to the Liard Hot Springs for a soak in the hot springs. This evening we head back to Watson Lake for the night.

Day 8 - Robert Campbell Highway

As we begin our second week, we wake up early and take on the longest stage of our entire trip: the Robert Campbell Highway. A wild, and primarily unpaved road, the Campbell Highway takes us through the most untouched parts of the Yukon, past the exceptional Francis Lake, as well as the communities of Ross River and Faro. With incredible views, and hopefully lots of wildlife sightings, today promises to be a highlight of the trip.

We reach Carmacks in the early evening where we check into a hotel for the night.

Day 9 - North, to Dawson!

Today we continue along the scenic North Klondike Highway, a route that promises more breathtaking landscapes as it winds meanders through the wilderness, to Dawson City.

As soon as we arrive in Dawson, it feels like you've been transported back in time as we drive down the dirt streets, lined with false fronted buildings and wooden sidewalks. This evening we have a night on the town where you'll have the opportunity to try what is quite possibly the weirdest tradition in Canada; the 'Sour Toe Cocktail', before going to catch a can-can show at Canada's oldest casino; Diamond Tooth Gerties.

Day 10 - Dawson History Day

We start the today with a guided tour around Dawson with Parks Canada. This tour gives us special, behind the scenes, access to some of the gold rush era buildings that are otherwise off limits to the public.

Then it's off to the gold fields! Here we visit the Discovery Claim, where gold was first struck in 1896, which triggered the Klondike Gold Rush. Hopefully you still remember how to gold pan from Day 2, because you'll have a chance to try your luck here too! After a stop at Dredge #4 we take a drive up the Midnight Dome for some incredible views of Dawson and the Yukon River.

Day 11 - Dempster Day

Today our adventure on the Dempster Highway begins, and we start the final leg of our journey to the Arctic. We will drive approximately half of the rugged 741 kilometre-long gravel road. This highway is truly unique, as the only road connection from Yukon to the Northwest territories, it is absolutely massive and endlessly surrounded by the isolated, untouched beauty of the Northern wilderness.

As we pass through the grandiose peaks of the Tombstone and Ogilvie Mountains, we will visit Tombstone Territorial Park, and its Visitor Information Centre. We then end the day with a night in Eagle Plains, which houses the only hotel/motel on the entire highway, as well as the last gas station on the way to the Arctic.

Day 12 - Into The Arctic

This morning we cross the 66th parallel, into the arctic. From there we then enter into the Northwest Territories and drive through the impressive Richardson Mountains.

Along the way, we'll also pass through the First Nations communities of Tsiggehtchic and Fort McPherson, and cross the Peel and Mackenzie River by ferry. Finally, in the afternoon we will reach our accommodations in the town of Inuvik, on the east channel of the MacKenzie Delta.

Day 13 - The Arctic Ocean

This morning we set off from Inuvik for the pinnacle of our trip: a day trip to Tuktoyaktuk and the Arctic Ocean. We drive up Canada's newest highway – opened in November 2017 and the first all-season connection to the Inuit community of Tuktoyaktuk and the Arctic Ocean. With such deep layers of permafrost, this two-lane gravel road was an incredible feat of engineering.

A notable natural spectacle as we head to the Arctic Ocean are the pingos, a vast sea of permafrost hills created by expanding ice cores. And then, 134 kilometres later, we are there. We reach Tuktoyaktuk and the shores of the Arctic Ocean. Be sure to follow the tradition and dip at least your toe into the Arctic Ocean.

This evening we all sit down for the included Farewell Dinner, and reminisce over the adventure we all shared together, on this Epic road trip to the Arctic.

Day 14 - Return to Whitehorse

This morning we bid farewell to the arctic as we fly back to Whitehorse. After being transferred from the airport to your hotel in Whitehorse, you will have a free afternoon to explore Whitehorse and its museums, or get in some last minute souvenir shopping!
